The 39 Steps notes from the director

First published in 1915, *The 39 Steps* was an adventure novel written by Scottish author John Buchan and serialized in Blackwoods Magazine in September/ October 1915.

Alfred Hitchcock, drawing on characters and situations created by John Buchan, filmed *The 39 Steps* in 1935 thus creating his own movie-thriller style. With it's 'everyman' who is inadvertently "guilty" of murder and possible treason, *The 39 Steps* is, in it's way, quite similar to Hitchcock's 1959 film, *North by Northwest*.

While the book and the movie are more serious in nature, the play adapted by Patrick Barlow pulls dialogue directly from the film and gives it more of a fun twist. Having only four actors playing all of the characters, the playwright estimates the two "clowns" play up to 250 characters. As the director, I'm not sure I agree with that number, but maybe you can keep count. You may also want to see how many Hitchcock references you recognize.

We are presenting to you a spy thriller, we will give you train chases, airplanes, shadowy figures, murders, and a love story, as long as you are willing to go on this wild ride with us. Suspend your disbelief and get ready to have some fun.

Besides his version of Lew Wallace's Ben Hur. Patrick's Olivier-nominated adaptation of A Christmas Carol has played off-Broadway and London's West End while his 4-person adaptation of The 39 Steps has played in over forty countries world-wide, winning Olivier, Helpmann, Moliere and Tony Awards and making Patrick the most performed playwright in America for 2012/13. Most recently his re-writing of John Milton's Comus has played to critical acclaim at Shakespeare's Globe Theatre. Patrick is also celebrated in the UK for his twoman theatre company National Theatre of Brent, whose comedy epics include Wagner's Ring Cycle, The Charles and Diana Story, The Messiah, The Wonder of Sex, The Arts and How They Was Done, The Black Hole of Calcutta, The Life and Times of the Dalai Lama and Zulu! They have won two Sony Gold Awards, a Premier Ondas Award for Best European Comedy and the New York Festival Gold Award for Best Comedy. Other screenwriting includes Van Gogh (Prix Futura Berlin Film Festival), Revolution!! (Best Comedy Jerusalem Film Festival) and the BAFTA-winning The Young Visiters. Publications include Shakespeare: The Truth! and The Complete History of the Whole World. Patrick has also appeared in Absolutely Fabulous, Shakespeare in Love, Notting Hill, Nanny McPhee and Bridget Jones's Diary. He is currently writing theatre versions of The Hound of the Baskervilles and Dracula.

JOHN BUCHAN, Author

My grandfather, John Buchan, would be amazed and delighted that a play of his novel, *The Thirty-Nine Steps*, is being published as a script nearly a century after he wrote it for his own amusement. JB was never proprietorial about his work - for example, he loved the 1935 Alfred Hitchock film of the book - and the more people who feel they want to put on and perform what was possibley the first spy thriller, the more delighted he would be.


On a serious note, two themes JB was anxious to convey in his novels were, firstly, that the veneer of civilization is very thin, easily exposing the horrors beneath and, secondly, that evil comes in very attractive forms, making it all the harder to resist. So the leader of the Black Stone gang in the book (Professor jordan in the film and play) is urbane, cultured, charming and established in British country life - to such an extant that Hannay cannot believe he is evil. Despite the deft and funny way the action in this marvellous script by Patrick Barlow is portrayed on stage, those themes are not lost. I think my grandfather would have been very proud.
